Course Description and Objectives:

This course is an introduction to Money and Banking. This course covers topics in the following parts: the financial system and financial markets; banking and financial institutions; central banking and monetary policy. Both theoretical and empirical issues will be emphasized. At the end of the course, students should be able to understand the concept of money and macroeconomic models though which monetary policy can be evaluated, and further analyze how decisions made by the monetary authorities concerning money supplies or interest rates can have real effects on the economy.

Readings:

The required text for the course is Economics of Money, Banking, and Financial Markets, by Mishkin (12th Edition, 2018) published by Pearson. In addition, it is also suggested that students get into the habit of browsing the daily newspaper *The Wall Street Journal* or *The Financial Times*, or the weekly magazine *The Economist*.
